

<u>Maths</u>

- Number songs and rhymes
- Count reliably in ones
- Number of the day/representation of numbers to 5.
- Positional language
- Shapes with 4 sides
- Comparing and composition of numbers to 5.
- Talk about and explore 2D shapes.
- Understand one more/one less relationship between consecutive.
- Link the numeral with its number value.

<u>PSED</u>

- Taking turns
- Feelings
- Mutual Respect
- Identify and moderate their own feelings.
- Think about the perspectives of others.
- See themselves as a valued individual.
- Know and talk about the different factors that support their overall health and wellbeing.
- Being a safe pedestrian.
- Make healthy choices about toothbrushing

<u>Literacy</u>

- Regular phonics sessions Little Wandle
- Guided reading
- Individual readers
- Make pictures/model and label using sounds we know
- Use sounds, phonemes and graphemes we know to record our own ideas
- Sequencing stories
- Practice mark making
- Listening to stories Diwali, Three Little Pigs, Goldilocks and Three Bears, Little Red Riding Hood, Nativity, Jolly Postman Christmas
- Retell Rhymes

Understanding of the World

- Gain awareness of cultures and beliefs of others, how other cultures celebrate Diwali, Remembrance, Nativity
- Use the outdoor environment to explore the changing weather
- Discuss Christian traditions- Christmas
- Use a selection of age-appropriate ICT to support learning
- Learn about different occupations and people who help us
- Understand that some places are special to members of their community.
- Show interest in different occupations.
- Recognise that people have different beliefs and celebrate special times in different ways.
- Draw information from a simple map.
- Recognise environments where we live.
- Describe their immediate environment.
- Seasonal changes from Autumn to Winter

Communication And Language

- Children to talk about their family and special events
- Speaking and active listening
- Develop vocabulary
- Model talk throughout the day
- Listening to a range of stories and rhymes
- Listen to adults and peers in the school.
- Have opportunities to talk to friends, partner, whole class, adults.

Physical Development

- Weekly P.E. lessons
- Talk about exercise and the effects on our body
- Write using the tripod grip
- Continue to promote good hygiene
- Encouraged to eat a range of healthy foods and snacks and understands the need for variety
- Develop fine and gross motor skills through carefully planned activities
- Handles a selection of tools, constructions and malleable materials safely and with increasing control, tap a shape, drill set, playdough

Expressive Arts and Design

- Imitate and create movement to music
- Change sound and pitch of instruments
- Use different media to make models, pictures and patterns/ Christmas Cards/Christmas decorations
- Experiment to create different textures/ compare and describe textures
- Listen to Christmas music and make own tunes or accompaniments
- Work with clay to make a diva lamp
- Imaginative play- bonfire, police station, home corner
